Claiming Continuing Education and Maintenance of Certification Credits

Claiming Continuing Education Credits

Includes CME, NCPD, and Nursing Pharmacology

To claim CE credit, learners must complete a session-specific evaluation located in the **HFSA Annual Scientific Meeting 2022 CME Reporting site**. The website is accessible via the:

- Virtual Meeting Platform
- HFSA ASM 2022 Mobile App
- Continuing Education kiosks onsite
- Direct URL (<https://ceu.experientevent.com/HFS221>)

To claim CE credit, complete the following steps:

1. Login to the site using with Last Name and Registration ID
2. Locate the session for which you're claiming credit by Title Name
3. Complete the evaluation

Claiming ABIM MOC Credits

Learners seeking to claim contact hours in the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) MOC program must do the following:

1. Complete a session pre-test within 5 minutes of the start of the session.
2. Complete a session evaluation at the conclusion of the session
3. Pass the post-test assessment with a 75% score

Learners must provide the HFSA with their 6-digit ABIM number along with their Date of Birth (MMDD). The HFSA will report all successfully obtained MOC contact hours directly to the ABIM.

To access session pre-tests:

Learners seeking to claim MOC or attending a satellite symposium are asked to complete a pre-test at the beginning of the activity. The pre-tests for ABIM MOC sessions and Satellite Symposia will be available on the Virtual Meeting Platform and HFSA ASM 2022 Mobile App.

Mobile App Access

1. Download the "HFSA ASM 2022 Mobile App" in the mobile app store.
2. Login to the app using your email and badge ID found in your registration confirmation email
3. Select a session under "Agenda" and click the "Conferences I/O" button at the bottom of the session page to view the pre-test.



Virtual Meeting Platform Access

1. Login to the virtual meeting platform at meeting.hfsa.org using your meeting registration credentials
2. Select a session under "Agenda" and view the pre-test on the right-hand side under the "Conferences I/O" tab

Claiming Continuing Pharmacy Education Credits (CPE)

Learners seeking to claim continuing pharmacy education (CPE) credit hours must complete the online evaluation for each presentation attended and submit their NABP ID and DOB (MMDD). Once evaluations are completed, CPE will be uploaded to CPE monitor within 60 days of the close of the activity. Attendees who participate onsite and via the virtual livestream will receive "L04" live credits; those watching OnDemand will receive "H04" home study credits.

To claim CPE credit, complete the following steps:

1. Login to the HFSA ASM 2022 Mobile App or Virtual Meeting Platform using your meeting registration credentials
2. Select a session under "Agenda" and view the evaluation in the "Claim CE Credit" tab in the session player.

Important Deadlines

The deadline to claim CME, ABIM MOC, and Nursing credit is 11:59 PM EST on Friday, December 16, 2022.

Pharmacists wishing to claim credit for attending a session must fill out the session evaluation(s) and claim credits no later than 60 days after the activity completion date. Any request for CPE after 60 days cannot be honored and credits will be forfeited.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is the meeting accredited?

In support of improving patient care, The Heart Failure Society of America is jointly accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), to provide continuing education for the healthcare team.



2. How many continuing medical education (CME) credits can I earn?

The Heart Failure Society of America designates this live activity for a maximum of **46.00 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™**.



3. How many nursing continuing professional development (NCPD) credits can I earn?

This educational activity is approved for nursing continuing professional development (NCPD) units by the Heart Failure Society of America, an accredited provider of the American Nurses Credentialing Center. This activity is approved for a maximum 46.00 contact hours (which includes 11.75 hours of nursing pharmacology).

4. How many continuing pharmacy education (CPE) credits can I earn?

The Heart Failure Society of America is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education as a provider of continuing pharmacy education (CPE). This event is accredited for up to 10.75 contact hours of knowledge-based CPE. ACPE Universal Activity Numbers (UAN): JA4008267-0000-22-008-L04-P (on-site/live virtual attendance only); JA4008267-0000-22-018-H04-P (on-demand/home study) Attendees who participate on-site and via the live virtual session will receive "L04" live credits; those watching on-demand will receive "H04" home study credits.



5. How many nursing pharmacology credits can I earn?

For Nurses who require pharmacology hours for their certification or licensure renewal, this year the HFSA Annual meeting offers opportunities to accrue a maximum of 11.75 hours.

6. How many MOC credits can I earn?

Successful completion of this CME activity, which includes participation in the evaluation component and post-test with 75% passing score, enables the participant to earn up to 9.25 MOC contact hours in the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program.

8. What is the deadline to claim credits?

The deadline to claim CME, ABIM MOC, and Nursing credit is 11:59 PM EST on Friday, December 16, 2022. Pharmacy credits must be claimed within 60 days of activity completion. Any request for CPE **after 60 days** cannot be honored and credits will be forfeited.

9. How do I claim credit?

12. Can I claim credit once I get home or do I need to complete onsite?

Yes. Credits can be claimed at <https://ceu.experientevent.com/HFS221> until December 16, 2022 for CME, NCPD, and ABIM MOC. Credits must be claimed no later than 60 calendar days post completion for CPE.

13. How do I access presenter disclosure information?

14. I attended a Contemporary Forum; how do I obtain credit?

Contemporary Forums do not offer credit.

15. What credentials do I need to log into the mobile app?

You will need the email you used to register for the meeting and your Badge/Reg ID #, which can be found in your meeting registration confirmation email. If you do not have access to that email, when logging into the virtual meeting platform at meeting.hfsa.org or the mobile app, enter your email to receive an email from <noreply@olihuh.com> with your badge #.
